

## Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 22 credits is required for a Regents diploma or Advanced Regents diploma. To earn a Regents diploma, students must pass five regents courses with a score of 65 or higher. To earn an Advanced Regents diploma, students must pass the same five regents courses, plus two sciences.

## About Our Community

Naples is located at the south end of Canandaigua Lake in the heart of the Finger Lakes. The district, which is primarily located in Ontario County, encompasses approximately 118 square miles and has a population of about 4,500. Located near two ski slopes, Canandaigua Lake, and miles of hiking trails, Naples provides learners with easy access to many outdoor attractions that can be utilized for local field trips as well as different extracurricular clubs.

## Academics

The Naples Central School District is committed to preparing students to meet the demands of the 21st century and help lead them to successful careers and rewarding lives.

- In 2017, 87% of Naples graduates received a Regents diploma and 33% received an Advanced Regents diploma
- 12 dual-credit college courses offered through Finger Lakes Community College (FLCC)
- Seven Advanced Placement (AP) classes are offered

## Special Education

Naples Pupil Personnel Services (PPS) provides for the academic, social, physical and management needs of each student. Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) specify what each student needs to achieve according to standards set forth by the State and are reviewed annually.

## Health Services

Each Naples school building has a full-time registered nurse whose duty it is to provide first aid and emergency services, administer medications, take daily attendance and monitor health needs or trends.

## Safety and Security

Naples is focused on providing each student with a safe and secure environment in which to learn. In addition to having a full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) on campus, entrances to all school buildings are secure and each building has an active safety team which conducts drills on a regular basis. The district fosters collaborative relationships with local law enforcement agencies, which is vital to building a safer school community.

## Technology

While the goals of higher-level thinking and lifelong learning have not changed, the tools and techniques of instruction have changed. Students today must utilize current technology to compete both in education and career. In Naples, efforts such as 1:1 iPad use give students the chance to interact and engage with their classmates and teachers more by encouraging collaboration.

Research supports that, when done properly, access to technology benefits classroom engagement. One research study that spanned 1:1 programs in six different states showed that a computing device helped increase students' interest in learning.
