Points of Interest

Board Member Jacob Hall thanked everyone for their thoughts and prayers on behalf of his family.

Superintendent Frahm stated that he had attended the annual NYSSBA Convention and one of the things discussed at the convention was the importance of establishing a mission and vision statement adding he is proud of the work the District did in the past year in developing the Naples Central School Mission statement.

Superintendent Recognitions & Updates

Superintendent Frahm stated the Bright Spot for this meeting is Mrs. Diann Payne, noting that on October 9th we had a staff conference day and for staff members who were not participating in the teacher leadership professional learning session there were individual professional learning options where individuals had the option to choose a session to their interest. Mrs. Payne e-mailed him, stating there were a group of support staff members who wanted to participate. Mr. Frahm stated Diann organized an afternoon of training for her colleagues in the Elementary school, commending Mrs. Payne on a very nice job, going above and beyond, and showing great leadership.

Internal Claims Auditor Evelyn Letta presented her quarterly report, noting the number of errors was up a little bit, however that could be attributed to the transition to WFL BOCES for the payroll and treasurer services, adding the District is continuing to oversee the process to ensure accuracy and any errors were corrected before paychecks were sent out to employees. Superintendent Frahm reminded the board that with Mrs. Burke's upcoming retirement in February the District is transitioning the payroll and treasurer responsibilities to the Central Business Office (CBO) in Newark, noting the District has the luxury of Mrs. Burke being in District to help with the training, oversight and transition to the CBO.

The Second Grade Team, including Alice Fitch, Diana DiGrande, Carrie Grove, and UPK-2 Department Chairperson Liz Dormer, presented an overview of the Lucy Calkins writing program, explaining what the program is and its effectiveness in their classrooms. The teachers presented a slideshow with the Board of Education and shared how the program works and how excited they are with the results of the program. Elementary Principal Kristina Saucke stated the teachers are excited to see how the students are enjoying the program and want to write, noting the District would like to continue to develop the program through 5th grade.

Superintendent Frahm stated he and Board Member Carter Chapman had attended the annual NYSSBA convention in New York City, noting he felt the sessions were excellent, highlighting the topics covered, noting Carter had attended the Communications Workshop; the Delegate Orientation & Annual Business Meeting; Teens, Technology & Suicide; and a presentation by the new Commissioner of Education MaryEllen Elia and that he had attended a School Law workshop; a presentation called Measuring What We Value which discussed how to clearly identify what your mission and vision are and then how to measure quantitatively if there is progress in attaining those goals; Collective Bargaining Update; and Crafting Collaborative Board Goals.

Board Member Robert Hotchkiss presented the Technology Committee report, discussing an overview of the Smart Schools Investment Plan recommendations which were divided up into three main portions, Infrastructure, Instruction and Safety.

Superintendent Frahm announced next week is School boards Recognition Week, noting what power public education has and the important role that school boards play in that process, publically thanking the work of our school board for making a whole lot of possibilities come to life for our kids, noting the sacrifices board members make to serve on the Board of Education, and adding there will be a pizza dinner for the board members before the next board meeting.

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Administrative Reports

Elementary Principal Kristina Saucke outlined items that appeared in the monthly Board of Education Report and spoke briefly about building Buddy Benches with High School Technology teacher Chad. Ayers' class, noting Elementary student Connor Betrus came to Miss Saucke at the end of last year with an article he had read in Highlights Magazine about Buddy Benches, adding she had contacted Mr. Ayers about starting the project in the fall and he and some students had come to the Elementary building and met with Connor and some of his classmates to start the project. Kris stated it has been a great partnership between the Elementary and the High School and they are very excited to have the benches and now the Art classes at the Elementary school will be working on developing designs to paint on the benches.

Miss Saucke also stated that in alignment with the Board of Education goals, the Elementary has started their Makerspace program, noting there are 40 students signed up to participate in the program, adding the program is currently two days a week however they are looking at expanding the program to more than two days a week.

Kris also reviewed information regarding the collaboration with their new BOCES Coaches for Math and Social Studies included in her Board of Education report, noting this work closely aligns with the Board of Education STEAM goal.

Secondary Principal Justin C. Stuck stated they had kicked off the Math Committee group on Monday and framed areas so that the District can move from where we are now to the front of the pack in our region, identifying what things will help us reach our goal. Mr. Stuck stated the goal of the committee is to develop a cohesive math curriculum from Kindergarten through Algebra.

Miss Saucke stated it was great to hear thoughts from the teachers at the different grade levels at the Math Committee meeting, and then discussed what the process will be moving forward.

Board Member Robert Hotchkiss asked for an update on the Elementary Safety Patrol. Kris stated the applications were very fun to review and the interviews were also interesting, adding they will be training for thirteen recruits two days after school next week, noting Deputy Jaus will be helping with the training, and the member induction will be at the October 30th rally.

Secondary Principal Justin Stuck stated the High School had the first meeting of the Shared-Decision Making Committee today, noting the committee is working on identifying key areas of focus, adding this is a long-term process, stating that today the committee had looked at the four areas they had outlined and tried to see how they relate to the school's Mission Statement.

Justin stated that Thursday would be the Honors Program Kick-off, noting each of the students will be presented with a Challenge Coin. Superintendent Frahm stated the Honors program students are on track to graduate having taken five of our seven Advanced Placement classes in addition to accumulating fifteen hours of dual-credit classes, adding currently there are around ten seniors, ten juniors, and thirteen sophomores who are on track to complete the program.

Director of Pupil Personnel Karen Meade stated the State Focus Review will be starting on Monday, noting the state will be scheduling a review every five to seven years, adding Naples Central School is the first to have a review completed in our area. Ms. Meade stated the process

will be very intense for about one month, explaining the review is a compliance audit of Part 200 regulations. Karen stated the department is looking forward to the review as they feel it is a learning opportunity, adding the report will help with establishing best practices instructionally and procedurally.

Student Representative Elizabeth Friend noted that October is never as jam packed as September, noting the varsity teams have finished their seasons, adding there will be back-to-back sectional games this weekend with the Boys Varsity playing on Friday and the Girls Varsity playing on Saturday. Elizabeth noted in Girls Varsity Tennis, Singles player sophomore Hannah DelGatto was ranked 2nd overall and would be continuing to State Qualifiers; In Varsity Golf, senior Andrew Fleischman achieved Player of the Year, adding there was an article in the Daily Messenger marking the end of the Fleischman Era, stating there has been a Fleischman on the Golf team for fourteen consecutive years.

Miss Friend noted that the Robotics Team competed in the Xylem Let's Solve Water Competition, noting the objective is to create an efficient water filter for use in Third World countries that can be made without using special filter materials, adding the team won the Most Elegant Design Award with a cash prize of \$1,000.

Elizabeth also stated the Spanish Class went to SUNY Geneseo to see a performance of *Don Quixote*, presented entirely in Spanish; and the PSAT testing for grades 9th-11th was just completed.

In my last report I shared that we have many new things happening at Naples Elementary that we will be updating you on in the coming months. Here is some exciting news:

"Makerspace" in our Elementary Media Center - On Thursdays and Fridays students will have the opportunity to stay after school in our Media Center. MakerSpace is a creative, do-it yourself space where students can gather to create, invent, and learn. In many libraries across the country they often have 3D printers, software, electronics, craft and hardware supplies and tools, and more. Expert advisors may be available some of the time, but often novices get help from other users. The makerspace - sometimes referred to as a hackerspace - is often associated with fields such as engineering, computer science, and graphic design. The concept emerges from technology, and in our school the makerspace is being embraced by the arts as well as the sciences. A new energy is building around multidisciplinary collaborative efforts! At this time Mrs. Infantino (Media Specialist) and Jodie Schwartz (Jr. Robotics Advisor) are running Naples Elementary Makerspace. Students in Grades 1-3 can sign up for Thursdays and Grades 4-6 can sign up on Fridays. We welcome donations and a list can be found on our website of needed items!

Collaboration with our new BOCES Coaches for Math and Social Studies:

• Melissa Kerrick will be working with our staff to provide coaching in the area of social studies. Her first day in district was Thursday 10/15/15 when she worked with Grades 1 and 2. Katie Infantino (Media Specialist) and Abby Caste (Art and Art Tech) joined both grade levels to work on a content integration plan. Feedback was very positive and both grade levels set goals with Melissa for their next session. Special Area staff members are incredibly appreciative to be involved! This work is closely aligned with our Board Of Education STEAM goal.

• Jessica Sheridan will be joining us for a K-12 meeting that will kick off our work this year in the area of Math. Our STEAM Board of Education Goal will be the focus as we set priorities at both buildings in this content area.

K-2 Lucy Calkins Writing Initiative: Diana DiGrande, Alice Fitch and Carrie Grove will share a short presentation on this work at our 10/21/15 Board meeting.



Building a Buddy Bench for our Playground: Chad Ayers and a group of High School students came to meet with our first grade student, Connor Betrus, and his classmates to discuss Connor's idea for a Buddy Bench. Mr. Ayers' students have completed a design and we are in the process of ordering materials for this wonderful character education project. Connor read about buddy benches in Highlights magazine and asked me if we could have one for our school. The idea behind a buddy bench is to have a place where a student can go if they do not have anyone to play with. When students see someone on the bench, they will

go over and ask them to join their group. Once Mr. Ayers' students are done building the bench, Mrs. Piedici and Mrs. Castle will have students help paint the bench with a design of their choice. We are very proud of Connor for his efforts to make sure all students feel included at recess!

Student Safety Patrol: Deputy Jaus, Mrs. Piedici and I interviewed candidates for student safety patrol last week. I have attached a copy of the application that students filled out. We were overwhelmed with how thoughtful many of candidates were, and we are happy to announce that we will have 13 recruits to train over the next two weeks. Our induction ceremony will take place at 8:30am on Friday, October 30th at our Rally in the Valley. Mr. Frahm will officiate the ceremony and Deputy Jaus will give students their belts and badges. Please join us if you are able!

Fun plans to get to know our High School colleagues and promote collaboration:

- The Elementary Staff challenged the High School staff to a game of Human Hungry Hippo after our October 9th conference day. I am happy to report that (even with Mr. Frahm helping the High School) the Elementary Staff won the competition! We want that bear back...
- On Friday October 23rd will have invited any interested High School Staff to join us for an "un-meeting" after school. I was speaking with some staff that enjoyed the format of the September "un-conference" because we so seldom get the chance to have a professional dialogue with our colleagues that isn't planned or rushed. Naples Junior Senior High School Board of Education Updates October 2015

Updates on Secondary building goals:

Adding "Energy" into the Math Department:

- On October 9 Conference Day two members spent the afternoon looking through their previous students' June 2015 Regents exams. Their goal was to better understand how students answered questions they didn't receive full credit for, in order to build a better picture of student misconceptions from those questions.
- 4 of 5 members of the Math Department are attending the Association of Mathematics Teachers of NY State (AMTNYS) on November 12/13 in Rochester.
- October 19 the K-Algebra Math Alignment Group met for the first time. This group has a broad plan of building curriculum maps that verify alignment between the Common Core Learning Standards and the resources being used at each level. Additionally the conversations between grade levels focused on math achievement will be invaluable.
- The High School math department has been having conversations about our appropriate pathways and whether we are meeting students' needs with our current structure. There is broad agreement around the table that we want more students to be aiming for and successful in Algebra 2, and the next round of conversations will be around how to achieve that goal.

Grape Festival was another glowing success. Our students groups on the front lawn made significant financial gains, and we saw another great crowd joining us for two spectacular days in September!



The 7th grade Advisory groups have been meeting each Tuesday with students afterschool and have done an amazing job starting this program. The teachers meet each Wednesday during a working lunch to talk about the previous day's activities and conversations and to strategize where they are heading next.



NSA met again on October 14 with a focus on the October 23 Spooktacular Event for the Elementary School students held in the High School.

We will be recognizing the group of Honors students on October 22, 2015 and presenting them with their coins. 
