Board of Education Vice President Joseph Callaghan noted that 4<sup>th</sup> Grade teacher Jeffrey Liebentritt has been doing a weekly science project in his class that has been well received by students and aligns with the district STEAM initiative.

#### Superintendent Recognitions & Updates

Superintendent Matthew Frahm spoke about Building Maintenance Mechanics Shawn Mason and Jim Delgatto noting some of the great work that they do. Mr. Frahm indicated that they are the focus of his "Bright Spot".

Mr. Frahm spoke about FIRST LEGO Robotics; it's alignment with the districts STEAM initiative, and introduced students who participated in a recent robotics challenge. Students on the FIRST LEGO Robotics team demonstrated their programming and talked about the various skills that they employed through the challenge.

School Counselors Monica Kastner and Bill Murphy presented a career counseling department report and outlined various resources that the department and district has to offer students, especially in the areas of STEAM.

Mr. Frahm spoke about a meeting that he attended with other area Superintendents where Senate Majority Leader Flanagan presented noting some various questions that were put forward to the Senator and his responses.

Mr. Frahm wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

#### **Out-of-District Special Education Programs Utilized by Naples CSD**

#### Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES - Finger Lakes Secondary School

6:1:1 and 6:1:1 Day Treatment programs provide small-group instruction with behavioral supports and group/individual counseling. Other related services available include speech-language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy and assistive technology services. The Day Treatment Program works in conjunction with mental health services and providers from Elmira Psychiatric Center. Day Treatment services include a family / home counseling component to support the student in all environments.

# Honeoye CSD 12:1:1 CORAL (Challenging Others to Be Responsible, Active Learners)Program

The 12:1:1 CORAL Program helps students in grade 7 through age 21 to develop independent living skills and readiness to enter the work force upon completion of their high school career. The majority of instruction is hands-on and project-based learning, helping the students to gain experiences and make valuable connections to the newly introduced concepts. The teachers and program help to support students in the attainment of a CDOS (Career Development and Occupational Studies) Credential. Student may be identified for completion of New York State Assessments or the New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA).

#### **School of the Holy Childhood**

The School of the Holy Childhood serves student with Intellectual Disabilities and Multiple Disabilities. Students may attend through age 21 and participate in the transition programs, preparing the students for adult services and an active life in their community.

The program consists of 8:1:1 classes for younger students. The intermediate and secondary classrooms are 12:1:1, and emphasize preparing students for life beyond graduation. The Transition Program is a component which focuses on job skills, vocational training, self-advocacy, life skills and more. Students attend vocational classes within the agency and then

begin to try out jobs at Holy Childhood and out in the community with the assistance of a job coach. Individual schedules are developed based on needs and interests.
