#### **Financial Statements**

Independent Auditors' Report – Unmodified "clean" opinion

- Difference between Fund Financial Statements and District-Wide Financial Statements
  - The first part of the financial statements is the district-wide financial statements that provide both short-term and long-term information about the District's overall financial status, which include property, plant and equipment and long term debt. The second part of the statements is the fund financial statements that focus on individual parts of the District, reporting the District's operations in more traditional fund detail than the district-wide statements.
- Highlights District-wide statements
  - District-wide Statement of Net Position
    - Overall there was a slight decrease in assets and deferred outflows of resources of approximately \$20K.
       Significant changes included the \$868K decrease in capital assets related to current year depreciation expense, balanced with a \$396K increase in cash and \$451K increase in deferred outflows related to changes in pension related items.
    - Overall increase in liabilities of approximately \$379K. Of the total \$36.5M liability balance and \$1.4M deferred inflows of resources balance, \$35.4M is made up of long-term liabilities which major items include serial bonds of \$22.2M, other post-employment health benefits liability of \$8.8M, compensated absences of \$3.1M and GASB 68 related liabilities and deferred inflows of resources of \$2.3M.
    - The District continues to record the long-term liability for the other post employment healthcare plan. GASB 45 requires a liability of \$8,827,806 to be recorded on the District-wide financial statements. This is based on the actuary valuation obtained by the District.
    - Increase in the net position balance by \$1M to \$7.6M at year end. The net position balance includes \$6.6M in net investment in capital assets, \$8.6M in restricted net position and a negative \$7.6M in unrestricted net position (caused by items such as the OPEB and Pension related liabilities).
  - District-wide Statement of Activities
    - Total revenues decreased over the prior year approximately \$690K. This is a result of how GASB 68 was initially implemented for TRS, which was corrected as of 7/1/2015.
    - Total expenditures have increased over the prior year approximately \$551K with the largest increase being in the instructional and general support categories, which are due to the use of BOCES' Central Business Office and pension related changes allocated as a percentage of payroll in each function. In general, the largest expenses to the District continue to be general support, instructional & transportation.

We have many new things happening at Naples Elementary that we will be updating you on in the coming months. Here is some exciting news as we continue our discussion on district goals:

Increasing STEAM Opportunities: We now have a classroom space dedicated to STEAM Education. This former intervention room has been turned into a great learning space to support multiple programs and curriculum. The "STEAM Lab" is right next to our technology lab, and will provide an environment to support our technology curriculum additions thanks to the smart schools funding. This room will also provide a consistent room for our MakerSpace after school program. We are working with teachers to create a schedule that allows them to sign up for times to use this great learning space for enrichment opportunities when it is not being used by technology classes. Another fantastic benefit to this room is that it provides an in-school location for our Elementary robotics program. Students will no longer have to travel to ST. J's for this wonderful extracurricular activity. ©

Outdoor Learning Space: We have a dedicated group of people who are ready to tackle this exciting Elementary goal! Our first meeting is on Wednesday September 21<sup>st</sup> at 2:40pm. We will work on designing a plan for our courtyard to become an outdoor learning space that will provide additional STEAM opportunities for students. We welcome you attend any of these meetings, and would be happy to share our google notes with you if you would like!

**ELA Curriculum Focus:** With the Board of Education's support we are thrilled to have Carrie Grove in the role of an Instructional Coach this year. As a teacher on special assignment, we felt it was important to set interconnected priority goals for the 2016-2017 school year that are driven by building needs, and support all staff and students. Our priority goals are the following:

- 1. RTI Support to the Reading and Math Specialists
  - Running quality data meetings with the principal that focus on instructional and curricular changes based on data analysis (\*benchmarking, progress monitoring, and data meeting dates have already been determined)
  - Systems management (RTIM, AIMsweb and LLI)

- Resource management
- 2. Curriculum Mapping
  - Maintaining/updating math curriculum maps and completing outstanding tasks from June
     2016
  - Developing the same high quality curriculum maps for ELA (\*template has already been set up and a calendar of meeting dates has been created)
- 3. Instructional Coaching: Support staff, paraprofessionals and students by engaging in collaborative work around curriculum and instructional strategies. Participate in the BOCES coaching training program meet 4 times per year with the cohort, and monthly meetings with Jessica Sheridan to focus on the following:
  - Coaching techniques
  - Running effective meetings/ setting norms
  - Building positive school culture
  - Best Practices

K-2 Lucy Calkins Writing Initiative is moving up!!: With the Board's generous support, we have looked at maximizing our bullet aid by targeting early literacy curriculum and intervention. Last year the Board of Education supported our K-2 writing initiative, and I am thrilled to let you know that teachers in grades 3 & 4 will be trained in early November to expand vertical alignment in this critical skill area. Our data discussion on our summer curriculum day focused on target areas, and writing was considered a need across all grade levels 3-6. We feel this is a step in helping close the gap in this area, and will promote alignment and common language for teachers when working together on ELA curriculum mapping. It was an absolute joy to listen to the primary teachers' excitement this year when looking at writing samples of their incoming students!



Open House will be on Thursday October  $6^{th}$  from 6:30-7:30 pm. Our Naples School Association (NSA) will host an ice cream social in the Elementary cafeteria. Ice cream can be purchased for \$1.00 and proceeds will go to supporting NSA's efforts to provide financial support for school field trips and other educational opportunities throughout the school year such as the

## **Technology**

The High School is excited to continue moving forward with the 1:1 device program. All 7th and 8th graders have been issued iPads and have the opportunity to utilize them both in and out of the classroom. To accommodate for the increased levels of writing demand in the High School, our Ninth Graders are being provided with Chromebooks. These devices afford students access to a keyboard and Google Apps.

Schoology, the new learning management system (similar to Blackboard or Angel in college) is up and running. Students with 1:1 devices are being introduced to Schoology simultaneously as devices are being distributed. Accounts are available for all other students as well.

Additionally, Mrs. Krenzer and Mrs. Radin-Snaith are currently pushing into classrooms to ensure that all High School students have access to their SchoolTool Student Portal Accounts and emails.

## **Communication**

Communication between home and school is vital in our learning community. To foster optimal communication, various methods of ongoing communication have been established to provide the most comprehensive, real time updates and information for families and community members.

- 1. The SchoolTool Parent Portal continues to be an integral conduit for families to access student grades and assignments. Mrs. Krenzer is working with families to ensure that accounts are current.

## **Town Hall Meetings**

Over the month of September, all faculty, students and staff will be invited to meet with building leadership to explore the following essential questions:

## **Engaging our Learners:**

Students are engaging in rich learning activities across all content areas. Instructional highlights from the first two weeks of school include:

#### Global

In Global, students completed a scavenger hunt which required them to access and utilize the various resources available to them in the classroom, including maps, primary documents, textbooks, periodicals and posters. Upon completion of this knowledge finding activity, Ms. Wolfe introduced a rich ELA / technology integrated project used the poem *Invictus*. In the first stage of this project, students are required to analyze the poem and identify literary elements (aligned with NYS ELA Standards) such as mood, tone, setting, and stanza structure. Following the literary analysis, students are instructed to complete research (using electronic devices) about the poem, the poet and the historical significance of when and why it may have been written. These ELA / technology integrated activities set the stage for a "Global" exploration of the historical implications of the poem and the great global leaders who were inspired and motivated by the poet.

## **AP Global**

Students in AP Global read the text, <u>Guns, Germs and Steel</u> over the summer. During ninth period discussions, students analyze the text and deepen their understanding of global studies. As higher level questions are posed about the text, students compete and must be "first to clap" to respond.











## 7<sup>th</sup> Grade English

In 7<sup>th</sup> Grade English, Mrs. Whiting discussed and created class rules with students. The class spent two days reading the sage advice of 8th grade students to the new seventh grade students about what it takes

to be successful. Students engaged in uncovering strategies for a successful seventh grade experience including organizational, social and personal habits / skills. The class read the short story "Seventh Grade" by Gary Soto and was introduced to the TEE writing organizer. They were eager to give the main character, Victor, advice on how to navigate the sometimes perilous middle school social scene!

#### 7th Grade Social Studies

Seventh graders are working on executive function organizational skills and US geography in Social Studies with Mr. Cummings.

#### 9th Grade Global Honors


Students will be introduced to Schoology in Mr. Petrie's 9th grade Global Honors class (as part of the 7-9 initiative).

#### **Model UN**

20 High School students will join Mr. Petrie on a field trip to Canisius College in Buffalo on Oct. 27th. Students will be assigned countries and will use technology and collaboration skills to research current challenges. They will work with other students from districts across the state to try to find peaceful resolutions to global problems.

#### Art

In sculpture class, students are completing a group project. Each group was provided an envelope of assorted pieces and instructed to make a sculpture that was free-standing, a minimum of 18" tall, and utilized all of the materials. To add further rigor, each group was required to have one blindfolded member who would assume the role of assembly, using only verbal instruction from the other group members! Students were completely engaged and had to utilize creative problem solving and communication skills.



## **JR Choir**

The JR Choir is singing rounds already! Ms. Flanigan turned the Taio Cruz song, "Dynamite," into a quick warm up round and reports that the Junior Choir is quickly becoming a singing force to be reckoned with.

#### French

Grade 7: Seventh grade students play a rendition of "Go Fish" to reinforce important vocabulary in French. Each "Go Fish" card provides a picture cue and the French form of the word.

## Spanish

Grade 7: Seventh grade Spanish students have been working on infographics for Spanish speaking countries. They are listening to authentic Latin music and can identify Spanish speaking countries in Central and South America and the Caribbean. Seventh graders can identify classroom objects and commands in Spanish, as well as introduce themselves!

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Grade 8: Spanish 8 students have reviewed vocabulary from last year and began a unit on weather and seasons. They also learned about the Tomatina last week, a "tomato throwing" celebration in Buñol, Spain. Students read, wrote, listened, and spoke about the tradition.

## **FCS and Health**

Students in 7th grade have been working on keyboarding and Ipads. They will all be able to access SchoolTool and Schoology for grading and assignments. In Jr. High Health, students are completing Wellness Wheels and in Sr. High Health, students are exploring Wellness & Mindfulness Techniques.

The efforts of our faculty and staff members have supported a smooth beginning to the 2016-17 school year and have prepared services and interventions to begin in the opening days. All should be commended for the time, communication and planning that began at the end of last year, continued over the summer months and came together in our opening conference days!

Kathy Grayson, PPS Secretary, will be attending a full-day training on September 15<sup>th</sup> to prepare for the latest change in Medicaid processing and claims. Districts will soon be required to bill State Medicaid claims directly. The State has eliminated the middle-step/support of a Regional Information Center in the billing process for School Supportive Health Services Program / Medicaid in Education claiming. Kathy has worked closely with colleagues in the Bloomfield and Honeoye Districts to secure this training and request related demonstrations of software/report systems that will support the process and make the new process as efficient as possible for Naples CSD.

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On Wednesday, September 14, 2016 our secondary special education teachers met with representatives from ACCES-VR (Adult Career and Continuing Education Services – Vocational Rehabilitation) and The Center for Human Services Education to discuss regional opportunities and supports for Naples students during their transition from high school to the adult work force and higher education. As these connections with agencies begin well before a student leaves high school, the group gained a firm understanding of processes, eligibility criteria and the roles of teachers, parents and the students. As early as the first week in October, our teachers will be working with parents and students to share information and initiate referrals for transition services with these agencies.

Mrs. Aubrey Krenzer, Assistant Principal and Data Coordinator, has been very generous with her time in our opening week, as she has shared her knowledge and training regarding our current data systems. This has allowed the PPS Office to gather, understand, review and correct data related to support services. Ultimately, these steps will simplify State reporting requirements, improve the accuracy of demographic and academic data and save many colleagues valuable time. Thank you, Mrs. Krenzer!
