A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Board President Margo Ulmer.

Public Comments

Diann Payne complemented Mrs. Natalie Ball and her Response to Intervention class for publicizing the Doodle Bees Newspaper noting that the class had Skyped with a newspaper editor from North Carolina. Ms. Payne shared a copy of the newspaper with the Board of Education.

Board Response

Board of Education President Margo Ulmer indicated there have been conversations regarding the use of safety and security funds both internally and externally with the village and town noting that although the district will contract with Ontario County in 2014-15 for the School Resource Officer, there may be opportunities to share this type of service with the village and town in the future. Mrs. Ulmer indicated the Board of Education hopes the village will continue to pursue a police force in the near future. Mrs. Ulmer also noted that the Board of Education will continue to have conversations surrounding the use of solar energy, but will move forward thoughtfully with the process, adding there may be potential to move forward with a project in the future.

Points of Interest

Interim Superintendent Gary Mix gave an update on the High School Principal search noting that there were twenty applicants and eight of those candidates will be screened, adding that the committee interviews are scheduled for June 25th; finalist interviews will be held on June 27th; that he is pleased that the applicant pool has grown, and that there are quality applicants in the pool.

Board of Education Member Ronald Burke recognized the passing of Rose Personte, former resident and Teacher Aide at the Naples Central School District.

High School Principal Matthew Frahm recognized Board of Education Student Representative Lissa Brautigam noting her many activities and accomplishments and thanked her for her service to the district. Mr. Frahm recognized Mr. Mix noting that he is finishing up his Interim position; that he provided the district with a great service that focused on excellence for all; and that there is hope that Mr. Mix will continue to "stay in touch" as he has established so many strong relationships in the district.

Mrs. Ulmer honored and recognized departing Board of Education Member Barbara Howard for her six years of service and departing Board of Education 1st Vice President Michael Boggs for eight years of service, noting that they have been well intentioned and competent throughout their service. Mrs. Ulmer noted some of their accomplishments surrounding budget oversight/modification and use of technology to transform operational practices.

Superintendent Recognitions & Updates

Mr. Mix recognized the Neapolitan Committee including Mr. Boggs and Mr. Burke noting that they have worked diligently to create policies and procedures for operations prior to turning it over to a selection committee.

Mr. Mix indicated that the Dawn to Dusk Committee should be more appropriately called the Pre-Dawn to After Dark Committee due to the extent of the programming. Mr. Mix recognized members of the committee for their efforts including Director of Facilities and Transportation George English and Mr. Burke noting that he enjoyed seeing the swim team be the first to enter the new pool.

Mr. Mix noted that this was his last Board of Education Meeting as the Interim Superintendent and that it might be his last Board of Education Meeting ever. Mr. Mix noted that Naples is a special place and he hopes others recognize and appreciate this; that the district consistently places in the top 25 % of the state academically; the district has great staff and educators, great students, and a dedicated and capable administrative team. Mr. Mix expressed appreciation to the Board of Education, to faculty, and to staff.

Character Traits Program

Teacher Jean Becker and Technology Coordinator Deb Wordingham gave an audio/visual presentation on the Character Traits Program as depicted by students in the Elementary School.

Technology Update

Instructional Technology Coordinator Anneke Radin-Snaith gave an update on instructional technology use noting that she had done a survey of students and parents, that Mr. Brown and Mr. O'Rourke, 6th grade teachers did ono-to-one I-pad use in their classrooms. Mrs. Radin-Snaith noted that program was well received and that the devices were well utilized. Mrs. Radin-Snaith presented a slide show that outlined successes of the program.

Elementary Principal

Elementary Principal Kristina Saucke thanked Jean Becker, Deb Wordingham, and Diann Payne for their participation in the Shared Decision Making Team and their contributions to the Character Education Program. Ms. Saucke noted that the Shared Decision Making Team went to Spencerport CSD and has been reaching out to other school districts in an effort to improve Character Education at Naples CSD noting that they have a meeting set up with Mr. Frahm to look at some new ideas over the summer. Ms. Saucke thanked Mr. Burke for coming down to Sixth Grade Fun Night when the district was short staffed on lifeguards. Ms. Saucke noted that the highlights of the night included the pool and an activity that allowed students to wrap staff in toilet paper. Ms. Saucke noted that Ms. Becker will be leading the summer maintenance program which has been renamed the Naples Summer Academy and that there are 108 students registered.

Secondary Principal

Mr. Frahm invited Board of Education Members and Mr. Mix to attend the Annual Senior Parent Banquet which will occur in the High School Cafeteria on June 24th at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Frahm noted that the district is in the thick of Regents week and that the district had a guest speaker in named Scott Greene, a Canandaigua CSD graduate, who spoke about his experiences as a Division 1 and Professional Football experiences and tied it in with work ethic, goal setting, and making good choices.

Pupil Personnel Services

Director of Pupil Personnel Services Alan Moore noted that the Special Education portion of the summer grown as well and that it is now six weeks instead of five, that there are now five sections instead of four, that more groups are being served, that the program overlaps with the general five week program, and that the program attempts to address issues surrounding regression over the summer.

Student Board Representative

Board of Education Student Representative Lissa Brautigam noted that students have been emptying lockers, that the athletic banquet was held earlier in the month, that the senior picnic went well, and that the Marching Band attended the Shurburne Pageant. Miss Brautigam also gave an update on the National Honor Society and trail maintenance, Robotics meetings, summer sports activities. Miss Brautigam thanked the Board of Education for the opportunity to serve and noted that she is much more skilled at public speaking as a result.

Facility Committee

Mr. Boggs noted that the project is coming to a close and that there are still some outstanding items that will be completed including a projector and screen for the cafeteria, rekeying of the Elementary School, seating for the teams in the High School gym, two wireless microphones to be purchased for the High School Physical Education Department, locks for the High School gym lockers, vision panels for four doors in the High School, and additional pool security measures. Mr. Boggs noted that the project has gone very smoothly given the magnitude of the work to be completed.

Budget Committee

Board of Education Member Barbara Howard noted that Budget Committee will meet again in August after new Board of Education members are in place.

BOCES Board of Education

Mr. Frahm noted that the Career and Technical Education graduation occurred in the Midlakes CSD auditorium, that it was well attended, that the programs there are top notch, and that graduates are well prepared for further career and educational opportunities.
