Board Response

Board of Education President Margo Ulmer noted that Board of Education Members Ronald Burke and Carter Chapman had replied to the inquiry regarding the Athletic Hall of Fame through discussions surrounding the Graduates of Distinction.

Mrs. Ulmer noted that the Board of Education appreciated comments regarding the Girls Varsity Basketball Coach from students and parents at the last Board of Education meeting.

Points of Interest

Mrs. Ulmer wished Superintendent Matthew Frahm an early Happy Birthday for Friday, September 5th.

Superintendent's Updates and Recognitions

Superintendent Matthew Frahm noted that copies of the draft Board of Education minutes for the July 28th meeting are available to the public and can be picked up on the table at the entry to the Cafeteria.

Mr. Frahm noted that Tuesday, September 2nd was the first day back to school for students and staff. Elementary principal Kristina Saucke noted that opening day went great, noting enrollment is up to 406 students in the Elementary, students and staff were excited to be back, and the building is already in full swing. Miss Saucke shared a newsletter with the Board of Education that is being sent home with parents and talked about the new therapy dog in training, Midas. Miss Saucke outlined a three question survey that was shared with staff. Junior/Senior High School Principal Justin Stuck noted the start of the school year has been very positive, lockers are being utilized, and 7th grade orientation, organized by Monica Kastner, occurred a few weeks ago. Mr. Stuck noted he had met with staff to talk about expectations and that Athletic night was last night (September 2nd).

Board of Education Student Representative Jericho Cervantes was sworn in as Student Representative for the 2014-2015 School Year.

Superintendent Frahm presented an overview of his staff opening day noting that the cafeteria staff provided a continental breakfast and Margo Ulmer spoke on behalf of the Board of Education. Mr. Frahm noted that instead of having a staff picnic after school, the district had a staff barbeque at lunch where Jon Betrus and Chad Hunt manned the grill. Mr. Frahm noted that the afternoon concluded with time for staff to look at curriculum individually and to set up their classrooms. Mr. Frahm reviewed his opening day presentation.

Mrs. Ulmer reviewed proposed New York State School Boards Associations resolutions to be put forward for future legislation, noting the proposed items would be voted on at the annual convention in New York City and Board Member Ronald Burke would be representing the district. The entire Board of Education discussed and determined which resolutions would be supported at the annual convention. Mr. Frahm noted there is an option to present additional recommended resolutions at the end of the annual meeting, adding that Mr. Burke and the Naples Board of Education should consider putting up a resolution to support the immediate elimination of the Gap Elimination Adjustment.

Facilities Committee

Board of Education Member Robert Brautigam gave an update from the Facilities Committee noting cameras are going to be installed on the playground and tennis courts, drinking fountains that include bottle fillers are being installed at both gyms, special non-abrasive salt is being purchased for the new sidewalks to protect the taxpayer investment, the district is proceeding with the Building Condition Survey, hooks for towels will be installed in the new pool locker rooms, and two extra rows of bleachers have been installed to allow the entire high school student body to be able to sit in the gym.

- (1) The New York State Teaching Standards, and their related elements and performance indicators/the Leadership Standards and their related functions;
- (2) Evidence-based observation techniques that are grounded in research;
- (3) Application and use of the student growth percentile model and the value-added growth model as defined in 8 NYCRR §30-2.2;
- (4) Application and use of the State-approved rubrics selected by the <u>school district</u> for use in the evaluation of <u>classroom teachers</u>, including training on the effective application of such rubric to observe a <u>classroom teacher's</u> practice;
- (5) Application and use of the assessment tools that the <u>school district</u> utilizes to evaluate its <u>classroom teachers</u>, including, but not limited to <u>structured portfolio reviews</u>; <u>student</u>, <u>parent</u>, <u>teacher</u>, <u>community feedback</u>; <u>professional growth goals*</u>; <u>school improvement goals</u>, <u>etc.</u>;
- (6) Application and use of the State-approved locally selected measures of student achievement used by the <u>school district</u> to evaluate its <u>classroom teachers</u>;
- (7) The scoring methodology utilized by the Department and the <u>school district</u> to evaluate a <u>classroom teacher</u> under 8 NYCRR §30-2, including:
 - (a) how scores are generated for each subcomponent and the composite effectiveness score of <u>classroom teachers</u>, and
 - (b) application and use of the scoring ranges prescribed by the Commissioner for the four designated rating categories used for the overall rating of <u>classroom teachers</u> and their subcomponent ratings; and
- (8) Specific considerations in evaluating <u>classroom teachers</u> of English language learners and students with disabilities.

Training on the use of the Statewide Instructional Reporting System, also required by 8 NYCRR §30-2.9 (b), will be provided once the NYS Education Department makes available the information required for such training.

This certification has been issued in accordance with the process for certifying lead evaluators described in the <u>district's</u> annual professional performance review plan.
