A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Board President Keith Swank

Recognitions:

Fiddler on the Roof Participants - Superintendent Ward thanked the students, parents and volunteers who participated in the school's musical production of Fiddler on the Roof for attending the Board of Education meeting, stating she was proud of all the hard work that went into the production and commending them on doing such a great job, adding she was proud that the students had also maintained their academic work as well.

Secondary Principal Norlyn Legler stated it was a real privilege and honor to have these students, adding she was very proud of the great job, noting the performance was unbelievable.

The participants were introduced and those in attendance commended them on a job well done.

Public Comment:

John Murphy commented on the proposed cut of the Girl's Bowling Coach, noting with an average of 30 participants or more in a large public place, it would be hard for only one person to monitor and coach all of the students.

Superintendent Updates:

Superintendent Ward stated when the maple tree was removed a fairly large limb was saved to be made into some type of project, adding Director of Pupil Personnel Kristina Saucke went to the stake holder groups for ideas and they have proposed having a sculpture of a graduate tossing his hat to a small child, adding we will get a plan for when it will be completed.

Board Member Joseph Callaghan stated we also were able to get a large amount of lumber from the tree which the school is hoping to use to build picnic tables and benches.

Discussion followed as to what to do with the stump of the tree, with Mrs. Ward suggesting that perhaps the school could make the stump into a seat. It was decided the school would have the stump removed as board member Joe Callaghan stated the stump would begin to rot at ground level within a few years.

Board Member Mona Sage-Cardinale arrived at 7:32 p.m.

Superintendent Ward presented information pertaining to Advanced Placement and Dual Credit courses offered at Naples Central School. Mrs. Ward stated that students prefer courses through FLCC and SUNY Alfred as they are more affordable, adding the school is looking for courses that can be offered as both dual credit and advanced placement, noting also that the school must keep enrollment numbers in consideration when looking at the schedule. Superintendent Ward also stated the school is looking at shared services with other school districts with programs such as students attending 1/2 day at Naples and 1/2 day another district or the use of polycams to access AP courses at another school, adding a regional High School study will help to gather information of where we are in comparison with other schools.

School Business Administrator Ann O'Brien presented information on accounting of Fixed Assets, recommending a limit of \$5,000 or more for financial statement purposes and \$1,000 or more for insurance purposes.

Superintendent Ward stated the school is continuing to look at additional budget cuts and will be presenting the proposed budget to various community groups.

School Business Administrator Ann O'Brien presented information on calculating a contingent budget, explaining they would start with the 2009-2010 adopted budget minus debt service to get the base, adding the proposed budget is below what the cap would be so it would not be difficult for us to build a contingent budget.

Committee Reports:

Facilities Committee - Board Member Michael Boggs stated on March 23rd, financial advisor Bernie Donegan spoke with the committee and on April 12th he will speak to the Citizen Based Committee as well regarding a financial review of the proposed building project. Mr. Boggs stated they will finalize a time line for a referendum after the next Citizen's Based Committee meeting. Mr. Boggs added that the committee is looking to prioritize the spending of those funds left from Phase I. Mr. Boggs also reported on proposed changes to the Community Park Foundation, stating they are hoping to all work together to determine rules and regulations of park use so that the park will move forward as a well organized and maintained facility for community use.

Policy Committee - Board Member Gail Musnicki stated the Wellness Policy would be presented for its first reading and the second reading would be on April 28th, adding the Hazing Policy would be presented on April 28th as well as the Fraternization Policy, and Social Networking policy.

Board Member Mona Sage-Cardinale presented information on the District Shared Decision Making Team meeting discussed cafeteria foods, stating the team was looking at what other schools offer

on their menus, adding they are trying to look at ways to make a healthier menu. Ms. Sage-Cardinale commented that the Shared Decision Making Team was a great group to work with.

Board Member Mona Sage-Cardinale stated she attended the Four County School Boards meeting and reported that the Chancellor was asked if any teacher ethics or professionalism courses were available in SUNY as there are questions from the various districts as to what to do if for example a teacher gets a DWI or is found with inappropriate material on their computer. The Chancellor stated that the teacher unions are so powerful that they do not know how to manage the teacher ethics but that he would take the questions back to the Board of regents and talk about different course work or conferences that may be offered. Ms. Sage Cardinale stated questions were also raised pertaining to how districts might share teachers with distance learning courses, adding the chancellor mentioned the Board of Regents is looking at Charter schools, homeschooling, etc, adding it was an interesting discussion but it left a lot of unanswered questions.
