"I found the learning walks to be very worthwhile. I enjoyed seeing different teachers and observing how they present the same material that I teach. I am walking away with new ideas to try as far as using technology, but also with validation for how I approach similar topics."


Our wonderful community also offers special events at this time of the year. Our students had

Naples HS Instructional Highlights



Instructional Highlight: "Children at War" Seminar

Students spent the end of October and the month of November engaged in a literature unit centered around the theme of "Children at War." Students chose one of three contemporary YA novels (*Legend, The Testing, The 5th Wave*) to examine and explore the following essential questions:

- What situations might force a kid to grow up too soon?
- Why do children fight in wars?
- What does it mean to be resilient? How are children resilient during war-like situations?
- What difficult choices are children forced to make in war-like situations?

The culmination of this unit required students to go further than a typical 5-paragraph essay in which they demonstrated their knowledge of the books and their characters' experiences. Instead, they presented their knowledge to a more authentic audience than just their teacher. Other NCS staff members and teachers graciously volunteered their time to be a part of this audience. During a 2-day presentation, students presented information about the plots of their books, the resilience their characters had, the difficult choices characters had to make along the way, as well as the many connections that can be made between the fictional worlds of these novels and the real-world experiences of many children today. It was such a worthwhile experience for all involved--students were so much more eager to get feedback from their authentic audience than they ever are to get a graded essay returned from me!

Special thanks to Monica Kastner, Melissa Steenburgh, Matt Frahm, Lesah McMullen, Anneke Radin-Snaith, Bridget Ashton, and two academic leaders--Rosey Byington and Carolelyn LaPrairie--for being a part of my class for two days.  minutes- complete summary paragraph and listing of major points learned they
 have in their envelope also a certificate that I earned in China for walking the wall.
- Students at another station write their name in Chinese characters
- Station: Students use the text and fill out a graphic organizer on the Qin dynasty including accomplishments
- Station: Students view a Confucius rap song on youtube summarize their learning and then view another of the 10 best lessons for life via Confucius - they pick their favorite 4 and explain why.
- Students view video on "The Story of Silk" and see step by step how silk is made. They summarize their learning in paragraph form and then write a paragraph on their opinion of killing silk worms to make silk. They handle and examine real silk.
- Future stations to be used: Chinese Art drawing video step by step. Foot binding the history behind it and they examine real foot binding shoes that I brought from China. Inventions of the Tang and Song dynasty. Acupuncture history and uses (created by the Tang).




Socratic Seminar: English 10

Establishing a culture of trust in the classroom allows for collaboration and an increased level of critical thinking. This past week, our co-taught English 10 class sparkled during their performance in our first Socratic Seminar relating to works by Charles Dickens and George Orwell. The students superseded our expectations with an incredible performance.

According to ReadWriteThink, a Socratic Seminar is a "formal discussion, based on a text, in which the leader asks open-ended questions. Within the context of the discussion, students listen closely to the comments of others, thinking critically for themselves, and articulate their own thoughts and their responses to the thoughts of others." The depth of student comments brought out higher level thinking in everyone. This student facilitated discussion helped them become leaders who challenged one another to expound upon ideas, or to adequately argue an alternate opinion. We were impressed with their level of engagement and independence and feel each and every one of our Co-taught students should be commended for their achievement. We also want to thank our students for valuing our learning experiences and fostering a culture of trust.

Instructional Highlight: Gemini Statistics

 FLCC offers MAT 121 Intro to Stats 1 and MAT 122 Into to Stats 2, which are both 3 credit courses, but the more advanced students can take MAT 200 which combines all of the Intro course materials into a single 3 credit

- In the most recent curriculum change for Algebra 2,
 most of the trigonometry content was replaced with
 probability and stats, which made this a reasonable
 transition for our students. The course covers a wide
 range of topics with the goal of helping students gain a
 better appreciation and understanding of statistics. We
 focus on various representations of statistics along with
 common techniques used to manipulate the
 appearance of data.
- Throughout the year, students will engage in a variety
 of statistics projects focused on collecting and
 representing data from the Naples School District, or
 Community. Students will also gain the useful skill of
 being able to create spreadsheets and use technology
 to quickly analyze data.
- This year we have 14 seniors taking the course. It is my
 hope that after completing this course, student will be
 better prepared to make informed decisions about the
 statistics that are presented to them in the future.








Graduation Process

Recent NYSED Update:

The Board of Regents has expanded the safety net option for students with disabilities to earn a local diploma. The amendment applies to the "superintendent determination option" for students that are seeking to graduate in January 2018 and after. The amended regulation allows students that have passed their regents level ELA and Math courses but have not successfully passed the regents exams to seek a superintendent determination by completing the requirements for the CDOS commencement credential. If a student has not had the opportunity to work toward a CDOS Commencement Credential, the principal can determine eligibility of the student to graduate in the 2017-2018 or 2018-2019 school year.


Training Update:
