A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Board President Jacob Hall.

Board Member Kelly Louthan commended Matt and our great teachers and staff at the school for doing a great job and getting things together and noted that one of the things they're dealing with in Corning is some teachers have chosen to do Zoom but now are primarily using Google meet which complies with state law 2-D with regards to technology privacy stating it may be a better option than Zoom.

Superintendent Frahm stated that is was really good point for a couple of different reason: One is the Education Law 2D that we've talked about at different points this year, the privacy, talking about Zoom bombing where people will find access to a zoom meeting and click on a link and will and will sometimes jump in with inappropriate comments or messages and also just being really aware of different privacy concerns especially based on age of children, stating technology director Anneke Radin-Snaith is looking into that issue.

Board Member Maura Sullivan commented that she wanted to give a little props on the creative note, stating it was pretty awesome to see that the play is accessible through television and how

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nice that it's out there for people who weren't able to get tickets to see it; adding the story hour is on Facebook as well, noting our staff is being really creative and proactive about getting things out there for the community.

Board Member Kelly Louthan suggested the board should be graduation and how we can make things graduation a very special occasion, an event, adding he really hopes things don't go that long but we should just plan for the worst and expect the best at this point.

Superintendent stated Graduation is a long way down the road but we always joke that when you come back from spring break it's a blink until you get to the end of the year, it just goes so fast even though you have two and a half months after break, adding we're right there with you and starting to think about how we can give students back some of those experiences for students. Superintendent Frahm stated, at this point we have canceled all school activities through April 14th adding that based on current data he thinks it will be pretty difficult to come back on April 15th, noting we have not done much modification to school events in school trips after the middle of April. Mr. Frahm stated he wanted to echo the sentiment that our faculty and staff have really gone above and beyond, noting they're doing a great job connecting with students and they're doing it in some fun and creative ways. Superintendent Frahm also stated he had received word from NYS at the beginning of this week that because we have been out of school, schools would need to use their vacation time and holiday time as learning time in order to be able to secure a waiver for the 180 days required for state aid.

Superintendent Frahm also talked a little bit about school budget; the current state of the financial system in New York has been pretty daunting adding Dr. Black has been taking a preliminary look at state aid runs we anticipate some decreased projections for next year.

Interim School Business Administrator Jeff Black presented a budget update, noting because of a change in reporting requirements so line items may have gone up or down in individual codes compared to the previous year. Dr. Black stated with the COVID crisis the District is looking at the what things are must-haves and what things are optional; bus purchases; Health insurance costs; Retirement system contributions; Special Education expenditures; budgeting for supplies and materials; estimated revenues and the Governor's proposed budget. Discussion followed pertaining to the information presented.
