School Property Tax Levy

District's limit for 2022-23 is 3.33%

- The Governor's cap is not a 2% cap.
- Proposed levy: \$12,668,202
- Voters authorize the budget; the school board authorizes the tax levy as long as it is within the tax cap.
- The board of education will set the final tax levy in August but it cannot exceed the tax cap.

STAR Savings Program

There are two (2) types of STAR depending on household income:

- Basic STAR is for homeowners whose household income is \$500,000 or less.
 The benefit is estimated to be a \$469 tax reduction.
- Enhanced STAR is for homeowners 65 and older whose total household income for all owners and spouses who live with them is \$92,000 or less. The benefit is estimated to be a \$968 tax reduction

Preparing for the Future

On May 17th, 2022, the Naples CSD community will vote on a proposed 2022-2023 school budget that was developed with the goals of preserving our current year's programs and services, both in terms of academic opportunities as well as extra-curricular.

The \$22,338,047 budget adjusts the tax levy by 3.33% which is within the parameters of what the NYS Property Tax Cap allows. This budget represents a 2.78% increase in spending from the 2021-2022 budget.

Over the past two years, our district students, staff, and community have navigated unprecedented challenges and changes due to the Covid pandemic. Fortunately, we seemed to have turned a corner in recent months and it is our hope this trend continues. With that, it also presents our school district with optimism that we can return our full focus to helping all NCS students attain the mission below:

The Naples Central School District challenges and supports all students to develop their diverse talents and abilities in a safe environment with rigorous opportunities. Students will graduate with the skills and confidence needed to excel in their chosen pursuits.

Through extensive conversation and entry interviews, it is clear that the NCS community takes great pride in supporting our schools. Further, it is evident that our staff and community endeavor to not only sustain the many outstanding opportunities NCS provides for students, but to continually look to grow opportunities while maintaining budget practices that are fiscally responsible. - (2) Eighteen years of age or older
- (3) A resident within the School District for a period of thirty (30) days preceding the annual vote and election.

Contingent Budget

Under state law, school boards can submit a budget to voters a maximum of two times. If the proposed budget is defeated twice, the board must adopt a contingent budget. The board also has the option of going directly to a contingent budget.

Capital Outlay Project

The District is in the process of submitting a proposal for a capital outlay project to the state education department. This project which cannot exceed \$100,000, will allow the District to replace some exterior doors and fascia at Naples Elementary School. The District will receive approximately \$63,700 in aid from the state and will recognize additional savings through improved energy efficiency.

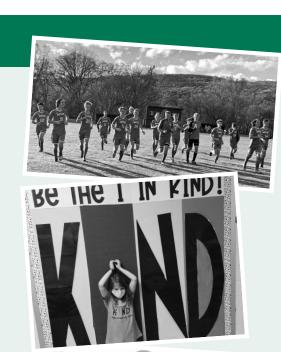

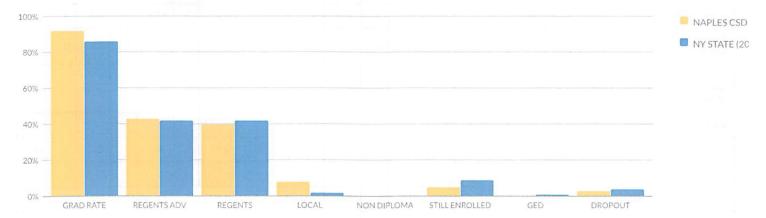
